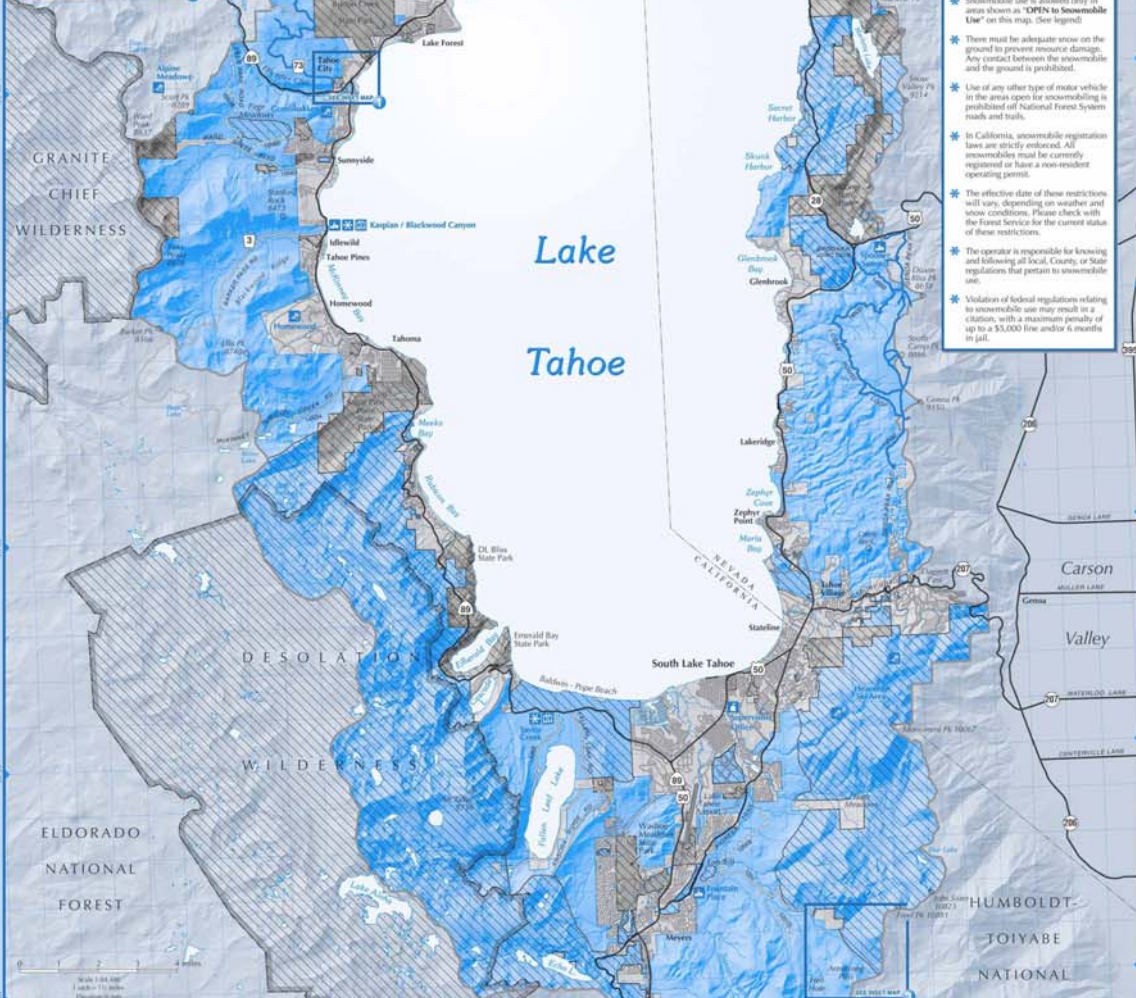

- Snowmobile Use**
- * Snowmobile use is allowed only in areas shown as "OPEN to Snowmobile Use" on this map. See legend!
 - * There must be adequate snow on the ground to prevent resource damage. Any contact between the snowmobile and the ground is prohibited.
 - * Use of any other type of motor vehicle in the areas open for snowmobiling is prohibited of National Forest Systems roads and trails.
 - * In California, snowmobile regulations laws are strictly enforced. All snowmobiles must be currently registered or have a non-resident operating permit.
 - * The effective date of these restrictions will vary, depending on weather and snow conditions. Please check with the Forest Service for the current status of these restrictions.
 - * The operator is responsible for knowing and following all local, County, or State regulations that pertain to snowmobile use.
 - * Violation of federal regulations relating to snowmobile use may result in a citation, with a maximum penalty of up to a \$5,000 fine and/or 6 months in jail.

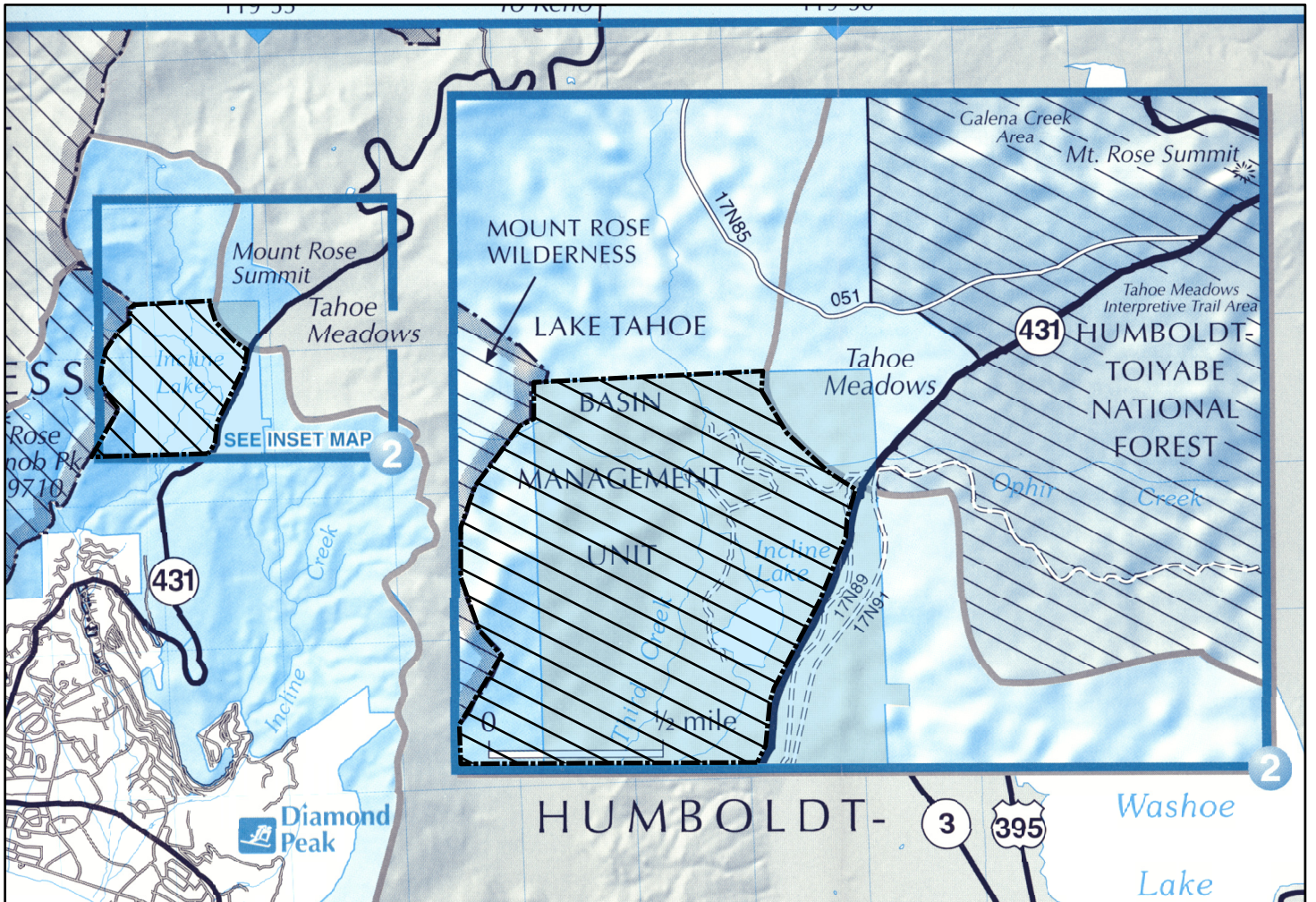
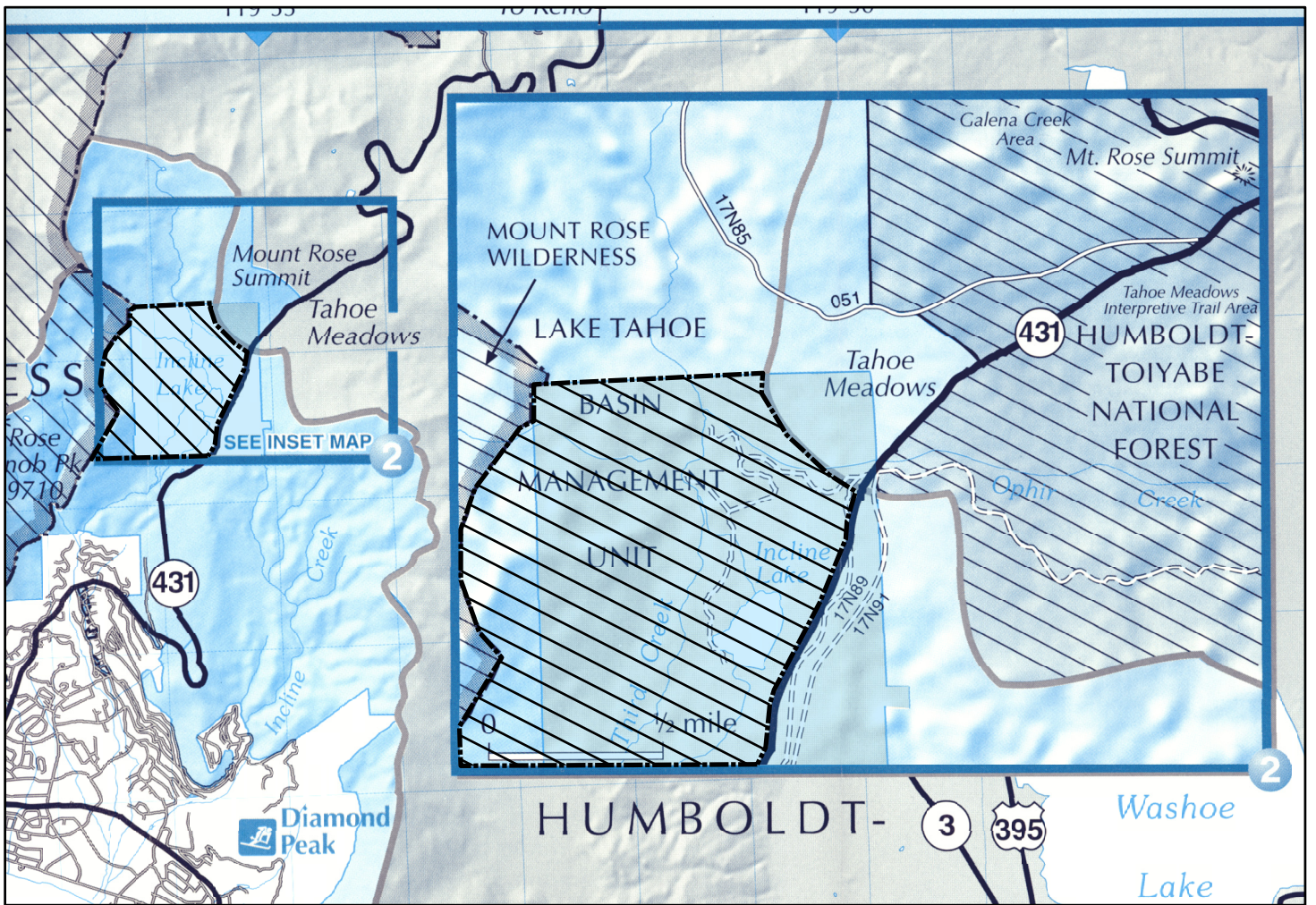

*** Greenline Snowmobile Routes**
Spoozer Summit groomed snowmobile routes are maintained by Zephyr Case Boat under a special use permit from the USDA Forest Service. Limited public parking is available along Hwy 50 at Spoozer Summit.
North Shore groomed snowmobile routes from Brockway Summit to Tahoe City are maintained by private snowmobile companies under a special use permit from the USDA Forest Service. Limited public parking is available along Hwy 207 at Brockway Summit. There are no designated snowmobile parking areas in Tahoe City.

Winter Vehicle Restrictions

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to protect natural resources and public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit. This Order is effective from December 1, 2008, through November 30, 2010. The prohibitions contained in this Order apply only when there is snow on the ground:

1. Using or possessing a motor vehicle off National Forest System roads in the areas shown as closed on Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.56.
2. Using a motor vehicle on a National Forest System road in the areas shown as closed on Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.54(a).
3. Using a motor vehicle on a National Forest System trail in the areas shown as closed on Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.55(b).
4. Using any rubber-tired vehicle on the National Forest System roads listed in Exhibit B. 36 CFR 261.54(a).
5. Using any rubber-tired vehicles on National Forest System trails listed in Exhibit C. 36 CFR 261.55(b).
6. Using any rubber-tired vehicle off National Forest System roads. 36 CFR 261.56.

Note: For the purpose of this Order, a wheelchair is not considered to be a motor vehicle or a rubber-tired vehicle.

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions contained in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both.
